rivals, will bring matching 5-0 records into the game. They are the only two teams in the league to make it this far without a loss.

Lowndes' Vikings won't see action until Saturday night. Coach Noel George's Vikes must go to Albany to face coach Luther Welsh's Dougherty Trojans in another 1-AAA test.

In other games Friday night involving area high football teams, Fitzgerald will be at Berrien (Nashville, Ga.), Irwin County (Ocilla) at Brooks County (Quitman), Cook (Adel) at Jeff Davis (Hazlehurst), Clinch County (Homerville) at Brantley County (Nahunta), Bulholtz, Fla., at Hamilton County (Jasper, Fla.) and Madison, Fla., at Santa Fe, Fla.

While rolling to their 5-0 record, Valdosta's Wildcats have beaten Thomasville (49-0), Dougherty (47-7), Crisp County (49-7), Bainbridge (28-0) and Albany (41-8).

The Moultrie Packers' five straight wins have been over Lowndes (33-6), Tift County (21-14), Dougherty (15-14), Monroe (34-14) and Thomasville Central

(34-7).

Lowndes' Vikings will carry a 3-3 record into the game with Dougherty at Albany on Saturday night. The Trojans own a 2-4 mark.

The Vikes have licked Central (20-6), Westover (45-6) and Crisp (25-15), while bowing to Moultrie (33-6), Thomasville (38-13) and Tift (6-0).

Berrien's Rebels, who have 2-3-1 and 1-2 charts, will be meeting Fitzgerald's Hurricanes, who are 4-1 and 1-0, in a Region 1-AA (East) test at Nashville.

Brooks' Trojans, who have four wins and a tie after five starts, will host an Irwin team which has a 3-2 mark. This game at Quitman will be a non-league affair.

Cook's Hornets, who are 2-3 and 1-0, will be shooting for their second 1-AA (East) victory when they take on, Jeff Davis' Yellow Jackets, 1-4 and 0-1, at Hazlehurst.

# 'Dosta, Moultrie Clash For Lead

Valdosta's Wildcats and Moultrie's Packers will both be risking perfect records when they tangle here tonight in a key game in the Region 1-AAA title scramble.

Coach Wright Bazemore's 'Cats and coach Bud Willis' Packers, who both own 5-0 records, are to meet at 8 p.m. at Cleveland Field.

Right now they share the top spot in the 1-AAA standings, but tonight's victor will take a long stride down a path which could lead to the league championship.

In other action tonight involving area high school teams, Fitzgerald will be at Berrien (Nashville, Ga.), Irwin County (Ocilla) at Brooks County (Quitman), Cook (Adel) at Jeff Davis (Hazelhurst), Clinch County (Homerville) at Brantley County (Nahunta), Bulholtz (Gainesville, Fla.) at Hamilton County (Jasper, Fla.) and Madison, Fla., at Santa Fe, Fla.

Lowndes' Vikings won't see action until Saturday night when they go to Albany to meet Dougherty's Trojans in a Region 1-AAA match.

Last year Valdosta's Wildcats and Moultrie's Packers had identical 5-0 records when they played at Moultrie. The 'Cats came away with a hard-earned 18-14 victory in that game. That means the Pack will have revenge on its mind tonight.

If the weather is clear and the field is dry, tonight's battle should produce some offensive fireworks. The 'Cats have been averaging better than 40 points a game and the Packers' average is just under 30 points per outing.

Berrien's Rebels (2-3-1) will be hosting Fitzgerald's Hurricanes (4-1) in a Region 1-AAA (East) test. Fitz, rated as one of the strongest teams in the state, is favored.

Brooks' Trojans will carry a 4-0-1 mark into their non-league game at Quitman with Irwin County's Indians. The Tribe has a 3-2 chart. This one is pegged as a toss-up.

Cook's Hornets must travel to Hazelhurst to meet 1-AA (East) foe Jeff Davis. The Hornets from Adel are 2-3 in all games, but own a 1-0 loop mark. Jeff Davis is 1-4 and 0-1.

Clinch's young and winless (0-5) Panthers will be the underdogs in their Region 2-B game with Brantley County's

high-flying Herons at Nahunta. Brantley is 6-0.

Hamilton's Trojans and Madison's Cougars are both 3-1, which means they will be shooting for their fourth triumphs when they face, respectively, Bulholtz and Santa Fe.

# 'Cats Duel Pack For Lead

Valdosta's Wildcats and Moultrie's Packers, a pair of traditional rivals with perfect records, are to clash here Friday night in a Region 1-AAA high school football game which is attracting state wide attention.

The duel between coach Wright Bazemore's 'Cats and Bud Willis' Packers is slated for 8 p.m. at Cleveland Field. Fan interest is sky high and a capacity crowd of more than 9,000 is expected.

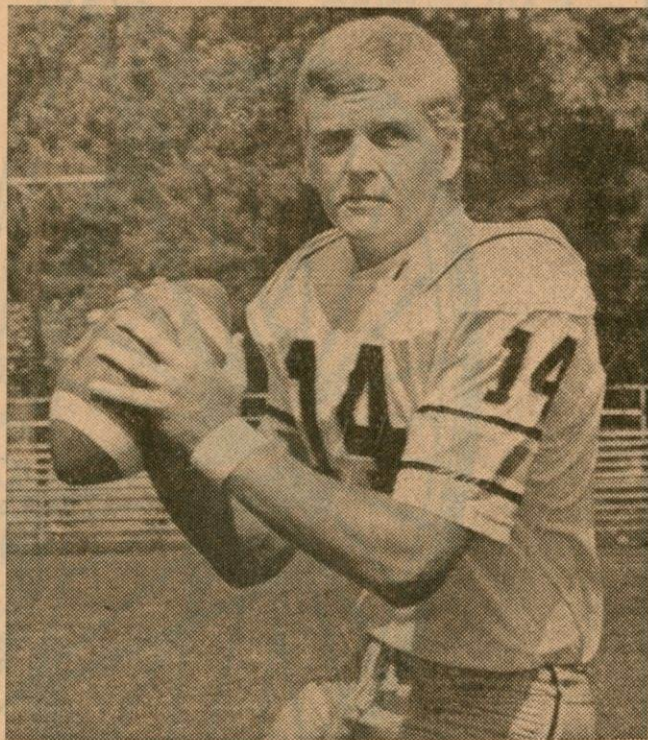
What's at stake is undisputed possession of first place in the Region 1-AAA standings. Right now the 'Cats and Packers share the top spot with identical 5-0 charts. They're the only two teams in the league to make it this far without a loss and both are ranked among the top-10 class AAA prep teams in the state.

Last year they met at Moultrie under similar circumstances and the 'Cats came away with a hard-earned, 19-12, victory. That means the Pack will come to town tomorrow night with revenge on their minds.

"What we're going to be playing tomorrow night is a typical Moultrie team," VHS grid boss Bazemore said. "That means they're well coached, they have good size, they are exceptionally fast, they have balance and they will bust you wide open.

"Our players can look at Moultrie's record and tell for themselves that it is a team which is far superior in every way to anyone we've faced so far."

The team statistics on both the 'Cats and Packers are eye poppers. VHS has scored 214 points, while allowing 22. The 'Cats have averaged 409 yards per game on offense and 163 on defense. Moultrie has accounted for 137 points and yielded only 55. The Pack is averaging 305.6 yards per outing on offense and

235 on defense. Willis' crew owns the best pass defense in the region, permitting just 74 yards a game through the air. Valdosta's attack will be led by quarterback Stanley Bounds, who has hit on 46 of 87 tosses for 909 yards and his picked up 261 yards along the ground on 36 carries. His favorite aerial target is split end Stanford Rome, who has made 22 catches for 530 yards. Other VHS rushing leaders include fullback Pat O'Neal (28-138) and halfback Robert Daniels (27-137).

Moultrie is sparked by multi-talented quarterback Ray Goff. He has hit on 36 of 79 tosses for 612 yards and has gained 138 yards along the ground on 23 carries.

The Packers leading rushers are a pair of swifties named Florazel Lamar and Donnie Moore. Lamar has galloped for 283 yards on 46 tries and Moore

In one other major change, end Scott Griffin has been moved from defense to offense.

It is expected to look like this: ends David Berrien and O. D. Netter, tackles Steve Stanaland and Freddy Welbon, middle guard Gary Irby or Arthus Massey, linebackers Dick Parker, Edwin Pompey, Jim Clarkston and Ronald Daniels and deep backs Gary Rowe and Alvin Payton.

Parker is a triple-duty man for the Wildcats. In addition to linebacker, he has also played quite a bit on offense at quarterback and he is the 'Wildcats' extra point kicker.

# Packers, 'Cats Renew Rivalry

There'll be at least one less among Georgia's perfect grid ranks as Moultrie and Valdosta put their 5-0 records on the line in Valdosta's Cleveland Field Friday night.

This isn't the first time the two have entered the bitter 1-AAA rivalry with perfect marks. But never has Moultrie come out on top when both were undefeated.

The last time the Packers upended the Wildcats was in 1967, one of the very few years Valdosta finished among the also rans.

Somewhat of a surprise in the unbeatens in South Georgia is Glynn Academy. The Red Terrors have polished off four foes and the only blemish is a 6-6 opening game deadlock with Brunswick High, in a game which does not count in league standings.

Another eyebrow-raiser in the South Georgia area is the 6-0 record Brantley has posted in 2-B. The Herons, who are only in their third year of football although annually rated as a basketball power, have used scoring versatility plus a solid defense for their gaudy mark.

Cairo, in its second year under Coach Jeff McCord, was expected to have a good season and is doing just that with its current 5-0 showing. The Syrupmakers are travel-

ing cross the border Friday night for renewal of its ancient rivalry with Quincy Shanks on Florida soil.

# Wildcats Trip Up Bearcats

Valdosta's Wildcats muffed some scoring chances and got hit by a barrage of penalties, but still came away with a 28-0 football victory over the Bainbridge Bearcats here Friday night.

A crowd of approximately 7,500 was on hand as coach Wright Bazemore's 'Cats post-

ed their fourth straight win in the Region 1-AAA encounter.

The setback left coach J. B. Roland's Bearcats with an 0-2-1 mark.

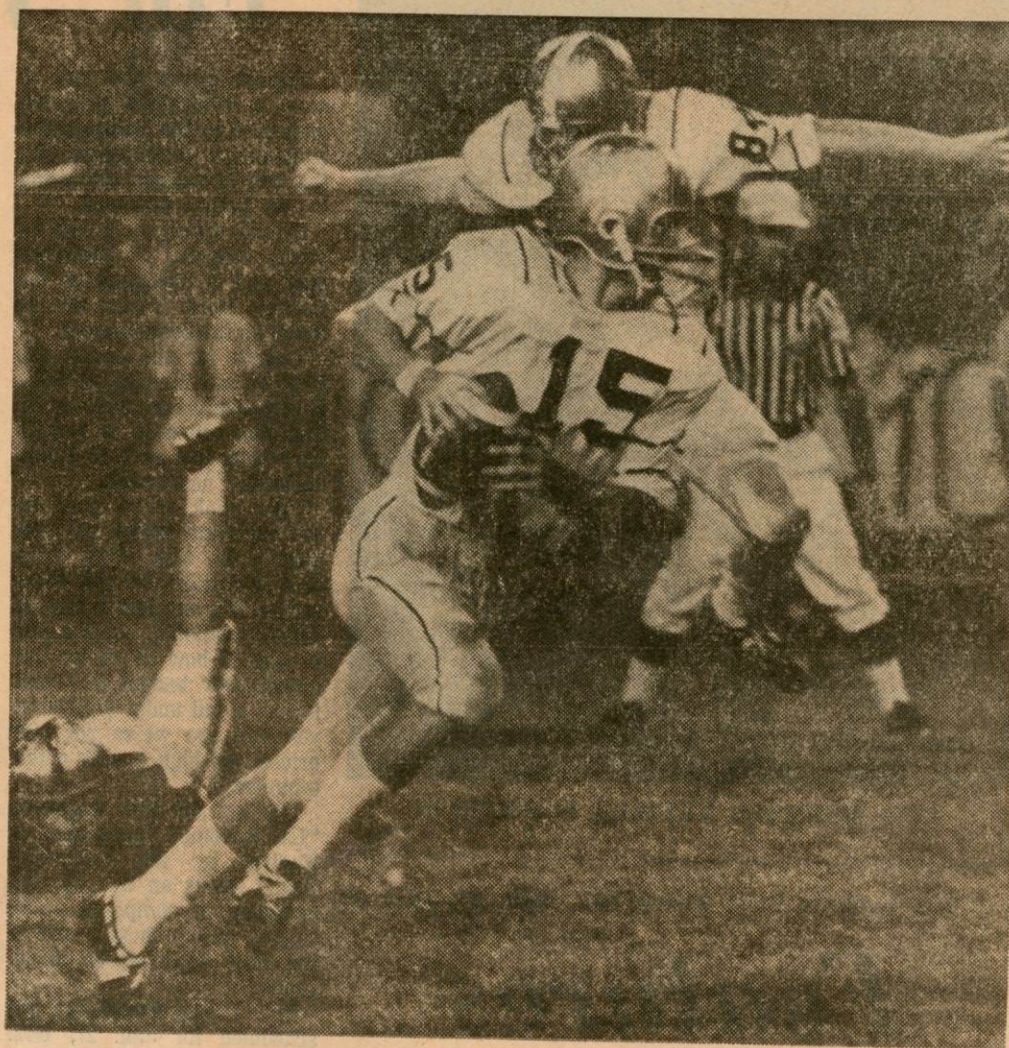
Valdosta drew 16 penalties, which cost it 130 yards, and had some other woes. While the 'Cats performance was on the ragged side, they went out front early in the game and were never in any real danger of losing their advantage.

"We won, but that's about all you can say," Bazemore, obviously displeased, commented after the game. "I've been trying to tell our players that we still have lots and lots of room for improvement. Maybe, just maybe they will listen now. Our performance left a whole lot to be desired."

VHS accounted for 387 yards (224 rushing and 163 passing) in total offense. The Wildcats' stop'em unit limited Bainbridge to only 60 yards rushing and 46 passing and kept the Bearcats outside the 35 yard line. The 'Dosta defenders accounted for three fumble recoveries and intercepted a pair of passes and posted their second "shutout" in four starts.

Quarterback Stanley Bounds led the Valdosta attack. He carried the ball nine times and picked up 119 yards rushing. Included were romps of 51 and 40 yards, both of which set up TDs. The senior signal-caller hit on 10 of 18 passes for 163 yards. Two of his tosses were intercepted.

Bounds scored one touchdown, on a three-yard run, and threw 30 yards to end Stan-

ford Rome for another. Valdosta's two other TDs came on a one-yard run by fullback Pat O'Neal and a six-yard sprint by quarterback Dick Parker.

Valdosta fumbled away one scoring chance at the 10 yard line, had one long drive halted by the Bearcats' defense at the Bainbridge one, had a 15-yard TD run by Robert Daniels nullified by a penalty and saw a 33 yard punt return by Rome which carried to the one also wiped off the books by a penalty.

Safetyman Gary Rowe was Valdosta's top tackler with five stops to his credit. The pass interceptions were made by Parker and Larry Richardson. Jim Clarkston, James Savage and James Berrien were credited with the fumble recoveries.

Halfback Tommy Howard accounted for most of the Bearcats' rushing yardage. He carried 12 times for 41 yards. Quarterback Dargan Long completed four of seven passes for 46 yards.

The Bearcats' deepest thrust

was to the VHS 35 late in the second quarter. Bainbridge failed to move the football across the mid-field stripe in the second half.

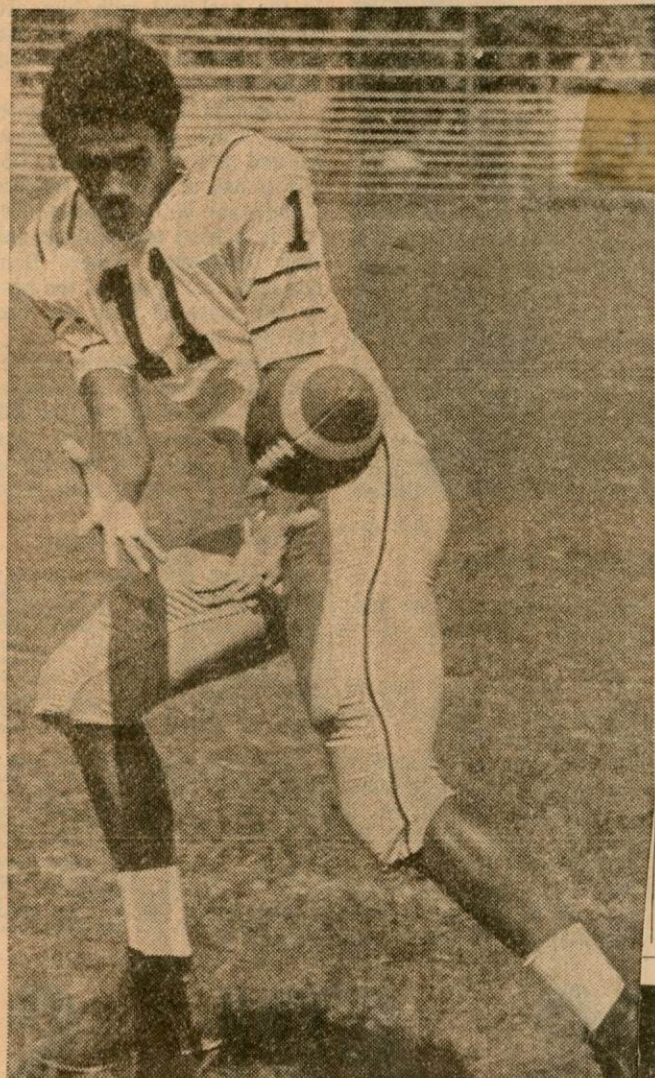
Albany's victories have come over Westover (43-8) and Thomasville Central (6-0). The Tribes' lone loss was by a one-point (22-21) margin to Monroe.

which enabled them to hold on to first place in the Region 1-AAA title race.

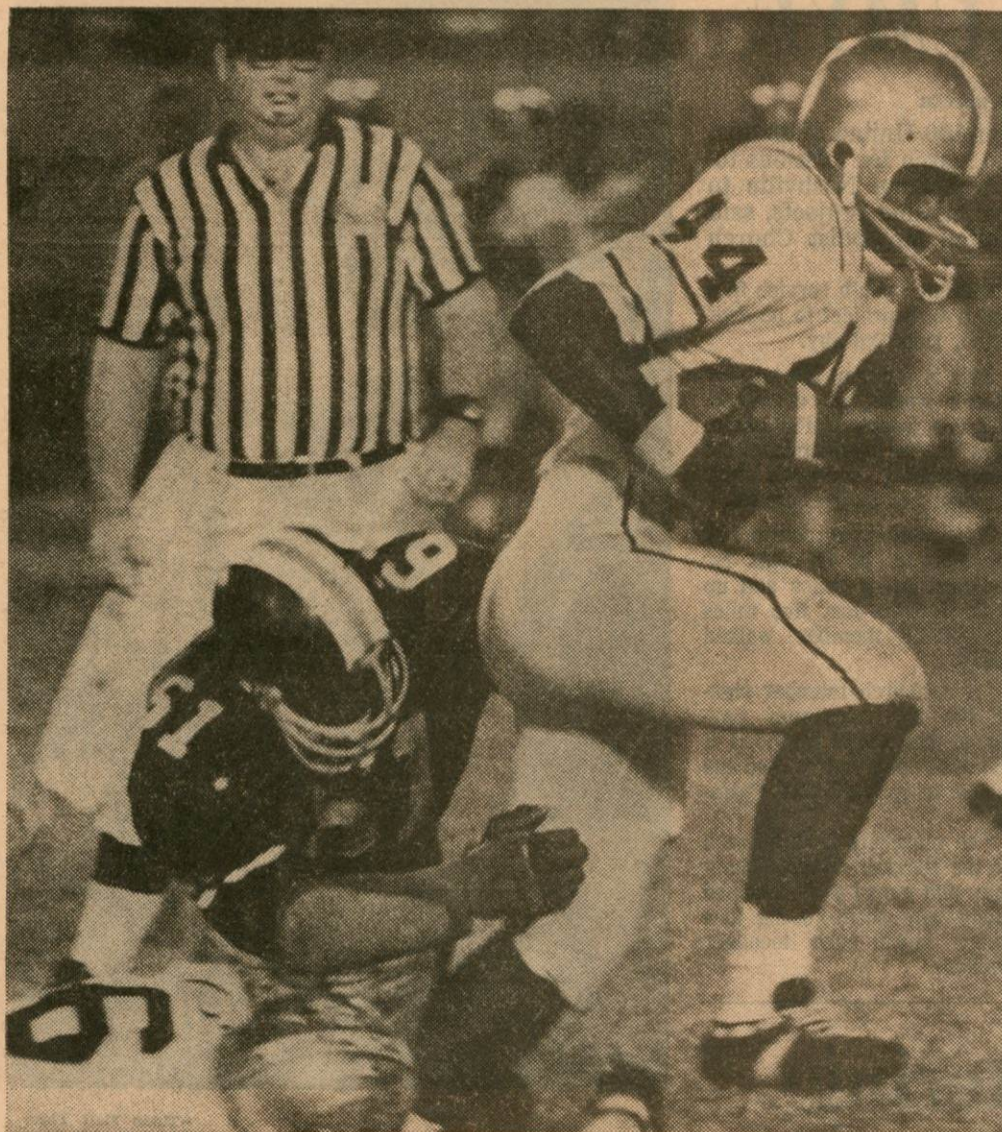
For coach Ferrell Henry's Indians the loss leveled their record off at 2-2.

VALDOSTA, Ga. — Valdosta's ultra successful high school football coach, Wright Bazemore, will be the subject of a television special next Tuesday night.

Bazemore will be featured in a special 30-minute program beginning at 10:30 a.m. on Channel 6 which has studios in Tallahassee and Thomasville.

Don Meiklejohn, executive director for news and public affairs of Channel 6, said, "Basically we are trying to tell the story of Bazemore and take him and show him as a person."

The program entitled, "Mr.

Bazemore," will include film of Valdosta ball games, crowds, bands and locker room activities. There will be interviews with Bazemore, locker room interviews and quotes from people who have worked with the veteran coach.

Meiklejohn said Bazemore was asked whether or not he plans to retire in the interview but the television executive declined to reveal the answer pending the showing of the program.

Bazemore came to Valdosta in the early 1940s and after one year assumed the duties of head coach. With the exception of time out for mili-

tary service he has coached at Valdosta High ever since, compiling an outstanding record in Georgia high school circles and winning state championships in every classification in which he played as the school grew larger.

Finally reaching AAA classification in the late 1950s, Bazemore teams virtually dominated the state's largest classification through the entire decade of the 60s. He followed this up with an undefeated regular season team in 1970 which lost in the second round of the playoff. His current edition of the Valdosta Wildcats is undefeated and is ranked No. 1 in the state.

Valdosta has been without a 100-point scorer since 192 when Giles Smith scored 116, but Stanley Bounds appears on the road with 66 and five games to go.

Bounds has 11 touchdowns to his credit, just three shy of what Smith tallied in 1962, but Smith picked up 32 extra points, something Bounds hasn't added to his repertoire as yet.

Valdosta's slick 1972 signal caller has scored three touchdowns each in the Thomasville, Crisp County and Albany games and added single six-pointers in the Dougherty and Bainbridge.

**MOST AMAZING** thing about Bounds' feat is that the Wildcats' No. 2 quarterback — Dick Parker — has scored 37 points off two touchdowns and 25 extra points. With Parker also owning a hot hand, along with Stanford Rome (44 points), and Robert Daniels (24) it means Bounds seldom plays more than three quarters in a game and most of the time only a half.
