



While on a routine patrol, flying from San Juan on August 16, 1943, they engaged a German submarine in a fire-fight. The plane was downed by anti-aircraft fire, after damaging the submarine which ultimately sank. He died in this action.

Popularly known as "Foozy" (from the Alley Oop comic character), he began his combat career over the Caribbean Sea flying in A20's and B25's. The mission was to patrol, from Saint Lucia, Trinidad, and Curacao airfields searching for German submarines.

Transferred to the Pacific, he served as a bombardier on B-29's flying against Japan from Guam.

He recalls his most memorable service experience.

While on Trinidad, he and another officer had dates for a dance with two Army Nurses stationed at *Fort Reade*, across the island. They "borrowed" an A20, flew over from their *Edinburgh Field* base to pick up their dates, adorned in their evening dresses. They safely returned them with the "borrowed" plane.



Perry M. Mullis Army Headquarters / 7th Major Port Co. As its title denotes, this organization was "mobile". They moved as required for port base operations. Serving on both the East and West Coasts of the United States, they moved to Northern Ireland, Scotland, and England, and continental Europe. Finally, they operated ports in Nagoya and Wakayama, Japan.





James Roscoe Mullis Army General Purchasing Agency Headquarters COM-Z Company I / 8th Infantry Regiment / 4th Infantry Division With COM-Z he purchased supplies for the Army from the local economy.

During the last five months of combat, he was reassigned to the infantry with the "*lvy*" division. He was injured when hit by a German artillery shell, while riding forward with the tanks.



Archabald S. Myddleton, Jr. Army 3673rd Quartermaster Truck Co. Served in the Ardennes, Rhineland and Central European Campaigns.





Augustus Hansel Paine, Jr. Army Air Forces VIII Air Force He flew fifty missions from England in B-17's.

He continued his career in the *Air Force* and was an Intelligence Officer. He died in India in 1975, while serving at *Royal Thai AFB*, Thailand.

Marion "M.C." Nelson Navy USS Sederstrom D31 / Task Force 58 Asiatic Fleet As a Gunner's Mate he saw action in the Gilbert and Caroline Islands, Eniwetok Atoll, Saipan, Tinian, Solomon Islands, and Guam.






